#### **PURPOSE**

- Highlights personal values and perspectives on teaching.
- Provides a context to personal philosophy of instruction.
- Provides evidence of experience and effectiveness.
- Highlights ongoing professional development and commitment to improvement.
- Displays contributions to scholarly work.
- Offers personal reflections.

A teaching dossier is ... "to teaching what lists of publications, grants and honors are to research and scholarship...It presents thoughtfully chosen information on teaching activities along with indisputable evidence of their effectiveness". (Peter Seldin, 2004)

#### BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF COMMON ELEMENTS

- Biographical Statement: A brief history of your teaching experience and how you began your teaching career.
- Approach to Teaching / Teaching Philosophy: "A teaching philosophy statement is a systematic and critical rationale that focuses on the important components defining effective teaching and learning in a particular discipline and/or institutional context" (Schönwetter et al, 2002)
- Methods & Materials: A description of the methods you employ for teaching and assessing students. Consider a description of the assessments and strategies you use.
- Responsibilities & Roles: Courses taught, designed/developed, non-credit workshops and sessions taught.
- Student Success: Evidence of student accomplishments can be provided in many ways, including student examination scores, and a record of pre- and post-tests results. With permission student work examples can be used as evidence.
- Peer Feedback: Notes, recognition, and letters of support.
